

Adamstown Sports Masterplan

Frequently Asked Questions

Why is a masterplan being developed?

In 2020, CN adopted a 10 year Strategic Sports Plan (SSP) to address future demand and inform the ongoing supply, maintenance and upgrade of sporting infrastructure.

The SSP provided a number of recommendations relating to Adamstown Park including to prepare a masterplan to:

- *Improve field layout, drainage, irrigation and lighting layout*
- *Improve playing surfaces*
- *Upgrade amenities for football and cricket; and*
- *Ensure infrastructure at Adamstown No. 1 complies with NPL standards*

What consultation has been carried out to date?

Initial consultation has been carried out with key sporting users of the park including Broadmeadow Magic Junior and Senior Football Club, Newcastle Cricket (Junior and Senior), Newcastle Suns Football Club and Adamstown Rosebuds Junior and Senior Football Club.

What improvements for sport does the masterplan include?

Key improvements include:

- Improved field layout to increase the number of FIFA standard soccer fields from 2 to 4
- Flood lighting renewal to competition standard and install energy efficient LED fittings
- Refurbishment of cricket nets
- Improved irrigation and drainage
- New toilet amenities to service Adamstown No.3, No.4 and No.5 sports grounds
- Extension of existing amenity building including toilets and gender neutral change rooms
- Consolidated canteen, toilet and storage facility at Adamstown No.1 sports ground
- Sport and Community Multipurpose Clubroom and Amenities Building at Myers Park

What improvements for recreation does the masterplan include?

Key improvements include:

- Continuous 3m wide concrete shared path. Approx. 1.5km to be provided for walkers/ runners
- 3 Fitness stations with water stations
- Multipurpose active court near Myers Lane
- New playground and multipurpose active court near Glebe Road
- Increase in trees and landscaping

When will the masterplan be implemented?

The Masterplan will be implemented in stages over a 10 year period with approved grant funding works being implemented as Stage 1 in the next financial year.

What works are being carried out as part of grant funding?

Broadmeadow Magic Junior Football Club has been successful in receiving grant funding under the Greater Cities and Regional Sport Facility Fund 2021/22 for the Myers Park Multipurpose Sport Community Leisure Hub.

These works will be undertaken as part of Stage 1 implementation of the masterplan and include;

- Drainage works at Myers Park
- Fencing around Myers Park
- Covered tiered seating at Myers Park 1
- 3 Fitness stations with water stations
- Perimeter running track
- Multipurpose Active Court

What happens after public exhibition?

The project team will review any feedback received during public exhibition and then finalise the Masterplan. The final Masterplan will be submitted to Council for adoption in early 2023.
